
# EXCHANGE IS POSSIBLE FOR EVERYONE

- "I can't afford it"
  - You pay no tuition fees to your host university, you receive a scholarship, you can continue receiving your study grant from Kela
- "I don't want to delay my graduation"
  - Exchange studies will be part of your degree and won't extend your studies
- "Too difficult"
  - Instructions, help and guidance are available. Exchange is a safe way to try living abroad, you will have a support network both in Finland and in the destination country
- "I don't want to be gone for that long"
  - There are also short courses and you can complete your traineeship abroad
- "My situation does not allow for an exchange"
  - There is extra monetary support for health issues and for those with families (Erasmus+)
- "I don't want to fly"
  - There is extra support for green travel and Erasmus+ interrail pass



# TRAVELING GREEN FOR EXCHANGE

- You can receive an additional green travel grant if you choose a more environmentally friendly way of travelling; a train, bus, carpooling ride or bicycle
- Can be cheaper, less emissions, no weight limits for your luggage
- When traveling green, you can receive a grant for a total of 3 travel days per direction, thus a maximum of 6 travel days in total if both the outbound and return trips are made in an environmentally friendly way






# ELIGIBILITY FOR APPLICATION 1/2

- You need to be registered as attending at the time of application and during the exchange
- Your right to study must be valid throughout the student exchange and at least until the end of the following term.
- You need to have completed **at least 25 credits** worth of higher education studies by the time of application.
- The exchange period has to be (at least) a full semester, max. two semesters.
- Your study plan for student exchange must include studies that are equal to full-time studies (5 credits per each full month of exchange).




# ELIGIBILITY FOR APPLICATION 2/2

- The courses to be completed need to be **fully transferrable** to your degree at UH and should not exceed the maximum credits allowed in the degree (Bach. 200/ Mast.135 ECTS)
  - For destinations that have more applicants than places, the exchange must not exceed the maximum scope of the degree or require you to extend the time of your degree study right.
  - For other destinations, it is strongly recommended that the exchange period does not delay your graduation or unnecessarily extend the scope of the degree at the University of Helsinki.
  - Take into account the number of credits required by Kela in order to be eligible for student aid.




# THE RIGHT TIMING FOR AN EXCHANGE

- If you're studying in an international Master's programme, check with your programme's planning officer about your options and limitations to applying for an exchange.
- Some degree programmes have listed more information on this on the [Do you want to study abroad page](#).
- Include the exchange in your personal study plan (PSP/HOPS) in Sisu.
- In some programmes only a short exchange/summer course is possible!
- The host university may have restrictions regarding the study level of students applying. Check beforehand.
- Check the academic term dates of the exchange destinations, so that you can plan your studies before/after the exchange.
- Exchange on the spring of the last year of studies requires special care in planning



# WHAT CAN I STUDY ABROAD?

- As far as the UH is concerned, you can take courses in your major, optional studies or language studies.
- However, make sure to read in your faculty and degree programme specific instructions about how to transfer credits from your future exchange while completing your study plan for your exchange application.
- We strongly recommend you to complete a minimum of 5 ECTS / month with a goal of 30 ECTS / semester.
- However, your exchange university may have a specific credit requirement. Especially for destinations outside the EU/EEA you need to check the required amount from our destination pages. Also in Europe, several destinations require 30 ECTS / semester.




# FUNDING YOUR EXCHANGE STUDIES

## 1/2

### The good news:

- An exchange based on an agreement is tuition free (does not exempt from tuition fee to UH).
- If you are entitled to [KELA](#) 's student benefits, you can also receive them during your exchange abroad.
- You can also apply for other scholarships or travel grants from, for example, foundations or organisations.
- Living costs may be cheaper than in Helsinki






# FUNDING YOUR EXCHANGE STUDIES 2/2


## **...and the less good ones:**

- Make sure to budget expenses such as insurance, vaccinations, language exams etc. Field and laboratory courses may also have fees you need to pay.
- Fees other than tuition fee can be high in e.g. North America
- Inflation rate high in many countries – living costs may be higher than expected
- In some destinations it is difficult to find inexpensive accommodation




# EXCHANGE SCHOLARSHIPS

- University of Helsinki offers grants for those selected for exchange
  - You don't need to apply for the mobility grants separately
- Examples of grant amounts:
  - Erasmus+ : 490 – 540 euros / month + 200 – 600 euro travel grant (+ extra support for green travel, and for students with fewer opportunities)
  - **University bilateral exchanges: EUR 2 300 – 2 500 / semester**
  - Erasmus+ global: 700 € / month + travel costs








# UNIVERSITY WIDE AGREEMENTS

- Agreements open to all students (check individual restrictions).

- Information on open placements available ~2 weeks before the beginning of each application rounds, but may be updated until the beginning of the application period.






# FACULTY AND STUDY PROGRAMME AGREEMENTS

- Europe: Primarily targeted to students of the specific study field or faculty.
  - Students of the specific field or faculty have priority.
- Outside Europe: only for students of the faculty or study programme that has made the agreement
- Exchange opportunities around the world


# HOW TO APPLY? 1/4

Before starting your application, see [Do you want to study abroad? Start here!](#) and [get to know the exchange destinations](#) and [language requirements](#). You cannot fill in the application until you know the destinations you are applying to.


**The application process has two phases**

1. First you apply through us for the exchange (the University of Helsinki)
2. Once we have accepted your application, we will nominate you for exchange and you apply to the host university as an exchange student



# HOW TO APPLY? 2/4

- Register as an applicant by filling in the application form in Mobility Online.
- Select your own Faculty.
- If you apply to other Faculty's destinations, choose that faculty. NOTE: you can then not apply to your own faculty's destinations on this application round!
- Select the country of the host institution and the host institution.
- Select the Planned Field of Study of host University according to which study field you will study at the exchange university. Remember to check which study fields are available for exchange students at the exchange university.
- If you were not chosen for an exchange, you have the possibility to receive an offer of a vacant exchange spot without handing in a new application if you indicate so in your application and if you have applied at least to three destinations.





# HOW TO APPLY? 4/4

- Total number of credits retrieved automatically from Sisu
- Weighted Grade Point Average (GPA)
  - Copy from the transcript of records
  - All grades on your transcript taken into consideration - can not be changed
- We check and if necessary update the GPA and actual amount of credits from the transcript of records when the application round closes.
- Stay from / Stay to: estimate by e.g. googling the academic calendar, if not found in the destination description

# LANGUAGE SKILLS


- Your study right at the UH is sufficient proof of your English proficiency during the first phase of the application.
- For other languages in Europe (e.g. Spanish, French, etc.) UH requires language skills at min. level B1 (A2 in some destinations)
- Be prepared to prove your level of language skills during the second phase when you apply to the host university according to their instructions. Some destinations require a level higher than CEFR B1/B2.
- More specific information about [language requirements](#).





# SELECTION CRITERIA

- In cases where there are more applicants than places, your application will be included in the lottery if you fulfill the following criteria:
  - Your exchange studies (together with compulsory studies + all credits completed during your current study right) don't exceed the degree's maximum scope ( 200 / 135 ECTS)
  - You don't need extension for your study right (you see your study right in Sisu)
  - Destination outside Europe: you have not previously been on exchange from University of Helsinki outside of Europe
- Host university's criteria, including any GPA requirement they may have (GPA of all your studies in Sisu) and language requirements.










# RESULTS

- In about 6 weeks after the application deadline. You need to accept the place within 7 days of the offer!
- If you get selected, we will nominate you to your exchange destination as an exchange student -> you need to apply to the exchange destination according to their application instructions.
- The final decision on acceptance is made by the receiving university. Please note the receiving university has the right to reject the application.


